

Fidelity Checklist for Facilitators

Best Practices in Implementing a Parenting Education Series

Facilitators and program coordinators can use this checklist during the planning, implementation, and assessment phases of offering a parenting education series. This checklist is based on the efforts of RMC Research and Oregon State University to use research in defining best practices in implementing parenting education programs including multi-session series. Content of curriculum					
1. Use of evidence-based parenting education curriculum					
2. Materials allow parenting educators to personalize content and learning					
3. Curriculum includes child development information relevant to parenting skills					
4. Curriculum focuses on specific, practical parenting skills

6. Parental self-care is part of curriculum					
7. Curriculum includes assessment of parenting strengths and needs

11. Completed formal training in the specific curricula being taught

Ongoing assessment of curriculum implementation					
13. Organization requires assessment of fidelity to each evidence-based parenting education curriculum					
14. Standard parenting educator evaluations are collected on a regular basis for each educator					
15. Data are collected to document session attendance and participant retention					
Outcome measurement					
16. Parenting educators or organization staff measure changes in family outcomes					
17. Parenting educators or organization staff measure changes in family outcomes using measures specific to the parenting education curriculum					
Data systems are established and influence implementation					
18. Parenting educators and other organization staff have regular opportunities to review process and outcome data, assess progress, and make program improvements					
19. Parenting educators review participant evaluations					

During Implementation: Programming

Format of services

20. Group size is consistent with recommendations from the curriculum vendor					
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Organizations provide a supportive infrastructure

21. Adequate staffing for parenting education series					
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22. Sufficient program manuals and materials for program implementation are available					
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23. Administrative support is available and sufficient to support program implementation					
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24. Adequate staffing for child/youth education or for child care provided during parenting education series					
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Service delivery retention

25. Quality of childcare is monitored					
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26. Follow-up contact is made with families who miss a session					
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Curriculum fidelity items dosage & adherence

27. Number of sessions is consistent with <i>recommendation</i> of the evidence-based parenting education curriculum					
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28. Duration (amount of time) in each session is consistent with evidence based parenting education curriculum					
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29. Consistent methods are used to determine if key content is covered during a series, as identified by the parenting education curriculum

30. Use active listening skills					
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31. Demonstrate linguistic competence with limited-English speaking participants					
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32. Exhibit familiarity with range of family and community values					
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33. Well prepared for session					
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34. Exhibit positive interpersonal skills					
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35. Maintain a positive learning environment					
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Responsiveness of educator to parenting needs

36. Goal setting is facilitated during sessions, & progress is discussed					
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37. Parenting educator tailors delivery in response to group needs, without altering critical components of curriculum
